Thanks to the hard work and commitment of leaders at every level of our movement, Special Olympics continues to grow and the impact we make gets more significant every day! 2017 was one of transition. Neal Johnson retired after 20 years of dedication and commitment to the Special Olympics New York organization. Neal worked to better the lives of those living with intellectual disabilities through sports training, competition and wellness programs. Under his leadership, the organization grew to serve more than 65,000 athletes training and competing in 23 sports all year round throughout the state. We thank Neal for all he has done to better the lives of our athletes.

Special Olympics New York accomplishments this year included the following:

- 5,750 sports competitions throughout the state averaging 16 games a day
- Healthy athlete clinics providing a variety of health and dental exams and health promotion opportunities to 1,053 athletes
- Over 40,000 volunteers committed their time and expertise
- Our Unified Sports program continued to grow, reaching 3,503 Unified partners and over 86 athlete leaders representing Special Olympics New York in numerous activities and events

We welcome 2018 and the continued momentum to making a difference in the lives of individuals with intellectual disabilities, as well as our own.




