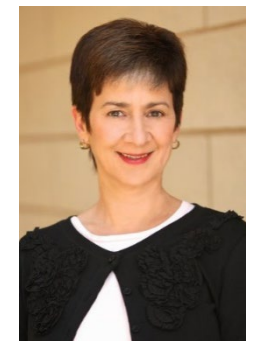
Mary Walsh Boatfield, President and CEO, Ability Partners, Inc.

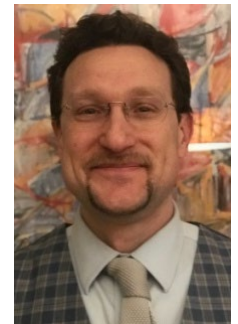
Theresa Maggi, Special Olympics Coach
